

#### NHTSA, CDOT, CSP and FHWA Launch "Move Over" Campaign to **Protect First Responders**


Message to Drivers: Move Over. It's the Law.

STATEWIDE — Every day on our roadways, first responders put their lives at risk to protect the public especially while on the side of the road. Traffic-related incidents are the leading cause of death for onduty law enforcement officers, fire, EMS, maintenance workers, and tow/recovery professionals. In an effort to protect first responders and others, a new campaign is educating motorists about the State's "Move Over" law that require drivers to move over and/or slow down when approaching stopped emergency and maintenance vehicles.


The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is partnering with the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT), the Colorado State Patrol (CSP), the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), and the Towing and Recovery Association of Colorado (TRPC) to get the word out to every motorist: Move Over. It's the Law.

"We see it too often," said Major Tim Keeton, Colorado State Patrol. "Law enforcement officers and first responders work in dangerous traffic situations all the time, but drivers increase their risk of being hit when they zoom by and ignore the flashing lights—and the law." According to recent data, 52 law enforcement officers were killed in traffic-related incidents in 2015. Out of those killed in 2015, 11
